

Vivaldi Browser

- Available on Windows, Mac OS, Linux, and Android (beta)
- Launched on April 6, 2016. Estimated 0.05% market share for desktop browsers in December 2018
- Developed by Vivaldi Technologies, a company founded by Opera Software co-founder Jon Stephenson von Tetzchner
- Its name comes from the Italian composer Antonio Vivaldi, who composed more than forty **operas**
- Targeted towards technically-inclined users as well as former Opera users
 - Built with customization and flexibility in mind
 - The power user's favorite Web browser

Vivaldi Browser - Features

- “Speed dial” – for frequently visited websites
- Extensive Tab management: Tab stacks, tiling, sessions
- The Capture tool lets users take screenshots of full webpages using built-in functionality.
- Sync service: Notes, bookmarks, history, open tabs
- Webmail
- Chromium-based
- Vivaldi can use many browser extensions developed for Google Chrome, and users can install them directly from the Chrome Web Store.

The Vivaldi Browser on Android

- Vivaldi says it doesn't track your movements around the web
- Websites you visit, cookies, and temporary files will not be stored on your device when you browse in a Private Tab.
